Skylarks and Meadow Pipits.

It has been thought that Skylarks no longer come and nest on Hob Moor. There has been a report of a sighting of a single Skylark rising and singing. We understand that Skylarks did disappear from Hob Moor but we are very keen to hear and encourage them back on Hob Moor. This is very much linked with the constant monitoring of how Hob Moor is land managed to enable the Skylark to return in numbers to nest. Please can any sightings of Skylarks be reported to Friends of Hob Moor who in turn will report the sighting to York City Council.

Meadow Pipits were present in numbers during the year and this is very encouraging.

Your Reporting Help:

We would appreciate in future that if anyone sees any wildlife on Hob Moor, sightings of Meadow Pipits or Skylarks or in fact any wildlife of significance (foxes) that you contact the City of York Council via phone or email to report this. We desire that the council get to

know exactly the life that is sustained on Hob Moor. There has been some ignorance on the part of the Council as to exactly what wildlife habitats there are. The Ecology dept at City of York Council in conjunction with help from St. Nicks are launching a Project to monitor/count/record Meadow flowers and Grasses in North Lane and on Hob Moor. Hob Moor School Planning Application:

Plans have been submitted to City York Council for the creation of a new area of playing fields, wetland areas and timber walkways, erection of fabric shelter over outdoor class space. To view this in detail contact www.planningaccess.york.gov.uk/applications with a reference number 18/01475/GRG3. At early discussions by Committee the concern is the Hob Moor boundary Hawthorn hedge and the little copse within the school grounds that we will be monitoring that this is not cut down and destroyed. The ridge and furrow protection it appears will not be open to the public but will be preserved for educational purposes within the school.
